## Navy struggles with approach to fix *USS Fitzgerald* as investigation continues

DEFENSE NEWS - The collision off Japan that claimed the lives of seven Sailors on destroyer *Fitzgerald* punched a hole large enough to drive a tractor trailer through, leaving the service with the considerable task of putting the crippled destroyer back together again.

The bulbous bow of the ACX Crystal left a 12x17-foot hole beneath the waterline, per three Navy sources who spoke on background, an enormous breach that rapidly flooded three spaces. Sailors had about a minute to evacuate their berthing, and several were awoken by salt water rushing into their rack, per two sources familiar with the details of the accident said.

There is no indication that the ship sounded a collision alarm, which would have alerted sleeping crew members to the looming catastrophe, prior to the collision. Those details, however, are the subject of an ongoing Navy investigation.

The collision also significantly damaged the ship's superstructure and SPY-1 radar array on its starboard side, and flooded out a main engineering space and radio central, rendering millions of dollars of expensive gear and equipment useless.

While investigators try to puzzle out what breakdowns lead to the tragic accident, the Navy is solving a complicated engineering problem: how to secure the ship enough to get the compromised hull out of the water. And then they have to figure out just how bad the damage is, if it can be fixed and where.

Navy engineers have managed to dewater most of the spaces and are working on a patch for the wounded hull, said 7th Fleet spokesman Clay Doss in an e-mail.

"USS *Fitzgerald* is preparing to enter drydock on Fleet Activities Yokosuka early next month to conduct follow on inspections and repairs," Doss said. "An ammo offload was completed June 25. Additional preparations include dewatering, defueling and temporary patch installation on the hull. Once the ship is docked, technical assessments will commence that will inform options to conduct long term repairs in the United States."

Since the outset, the Navy has been intent on fixing the ship. In a press conference immediately following the June 17 collision, 7th Fleet Commander Vice Adm. Joseph Aucoin told reporters that it would be a lengthy process.

"Hopefully less than a year," he said. "You will see the USS *Fitzgerald* back."

The emphasis in the early stages will be to stabilize the ship enough to get it out of the water, which the Navy says will likely be somewhere between July 6 and 8. Once its out of the water, the Navy will conduct a full survey of the ship.

## Mattis pleased with NATO progress combating terror

WASHINGTON — NATO defense ministers discussed threats to alliance nations from Russia and terrorist groups, and policies and capabilities needed to counter these threats, Defense Secretary Jim Mattis said in Brussels June 29.

Alliance and partner nation ministers also discussed the Resolute Support Mission in Afghanistan and pledged to grow the allied force helping Afghan security forces there. Mattis spoke at the conclusion of NATO's Defense Ministerial.

"We focused on terrorism and Russia's destabilizing activities both in cyberspace and on the ground," the defense secretary said during a news conference.

Mattis said the NATO ministers spent time discussing the alliance's enhanced forward presence opera-

tions in the Baltic Republics and Poland. These are battlegroups built around forces from framework nations -- the United States, Canada, the United Kingdom and Germany -- to which 15 other NATO nations add forces and capabilities.

"I've observed some of these forces in the field and it is really quite energizing to see young soldiers from across the NATO alliance working together in the forests of Lithuania and elsewhere ... as they make very clear in a wholly defensive orientation that we stand united and together," he said.

The effort in the East "shows a truly united NATO," said Mattis, adding that alliance nations are united in their appreciation of the threat and security situation.

"When you put your troops on the ground under other nations'

command there in the forests, you are making a statement of unity," he said.

Mattis made a point of the increase in the defense budgets of individual NATO nations. This allows the alliance to enhance deterrence in Europe and how it deals with threats outside the region.

The defense secretary emphasized America's commitment to NATO, citing President Donald J. Trump's declaration of support for Article 5 of the North Atlantic Treaty, which stipulates that an attack on one NATO member is an attack on all. Mattis also discussed the U.S. Senate's unanimous support of Article 5 commitments and the \$1.4 billion increase in the budget for the European Reassurance Initiative planned in the fiscal 2018 defense budget request.

The defense ministers discussed Afghanistan and Mattis held bi-

lateral meetings with the defense ministers at NATO headquarters. They discussed what is happening on the ground in the country and what gaps in support still remain.

"We filled 70 percent of those gaps right now and I am very, very optimistic based on what I heard here that we will be filling the rest," he said.

Mattis will take what he has learned at NATO and what he will learn from Marine Corps Gen. Joe Dunford, the chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff, who has just left Afghanistan before making his decision on the U.S. strategy in Afghanistan.

"That decision will be made by our president. It will be informed by what I picked up here from our allies, from our military commanders in the field, ... and it will be up to all of us to execute it to the best of our ability," the secretary said.

Navy Sailors have a long history of being tough and that is no different today. They are physically fit, strategically smart and more resilient than ever.

How do they do it? It starts with basic military training, where our most experienced Sailors instruct our newest Sailors. To continue our legacy of toughness, experienced Fleet Sailors need to join our training team.

We have more than 320,000 active duty Sailors around the world. Nearly 265,000 of those Sailors are in the enlisted ranks, all of them performing vital functions.

Whether they serve on an aircraft carrier, an amphibious assault ship, a cruiser, a littoral combat ship, a destroyer, a submarine, in an aircraft squadron or in an ashore unit, our Sailors are highly capable operators who help protect the world's sea lanes and keep America safe.

How do we train Sailors to be effective Navy professionals, no matter the type of ship, aircraft or unit in which they serve?

Recruit Training Command at Naval Station Great Lakes is the Navy's only boot camp where all of our enlisted Sailors start their professional naval service.

From the moment each recruit

weapons training; and be skilled in shipboard firefighting and damage control all while maintaining a physical fitness regimen, in which every Sailor must be able to pass the Navy's Physical Fitness Assessment before graduating and proceeding to in-rate training.

Furthermore, before graduating boot camp, every enlisted Sailor since 2007 has been battle tested aboard USS Trayer during Battle Stations (BST) 21. Trayer is a 210-foot replica of an destroyer, stocked with state-of-the-art special effects. Recruit toughness is put to the test in this overnight crucible that includes fighting real fires and flooding, simulated missile attacks, mass casualties and ship survivability scenarios.

Just as recruits receive basic

military training and mentorship from their recruit division commanders, their transformation continues in the fleet under the supervision of their division leading petty officers and chief petty officers.

We are all accountable to main-

tain our force readiness through advanced training in the Fleet. To achieve our mission and constantly prepare for the next generations of Sailors, we must continue to invest our most talented Fleet personnel as trainers for our future.

## Framework for Success: Naval Future Force S&T Expo

ARLINGTON, Va. (NNS) -- At the upcoming Naval Future Force Science and Technology Expo, to be held in Washington July 20-21, Chief of Naval Research (CNR) Rear Adm. David Hahn will announce a new strategic direction for the Navy's science and technology and research and development programs.

As adversaries move quickly to advance their technological capabilities, Hahn's vision supports Chief of Naval Operations Adm. John Richardson, who has said the pace of technology development and delivery in the United States Navy and Marine Corps must accelerate in order to maintain the technological edge for U.S. warfighters.

"We have a great opportunity to supercharge the engine of naval research," said Hahn. "From discovery to deployment, innovative U.S. naval technology has been essential to mission success. We're going to ensure that continues."

Details of the CNR's guidance will be unveiled to conference at-

tendees via a widely anticipated new document on the way forward for naval research: "Naval Research and Development: A Framework for Accelerating to the Navy and Marine Corps after Next." Conference attendees will get the first look at this construct to speed new technologies from research into finished products and into Sailor or Marine hands.

Senior naval leaders see the new Framework as a way to bring together in new ways all the central players in naval research, including government labs, academia and industry.

"Clearly a goal of the Framework is to accelerate what we do," said Dr. Walter Jones, executive director of the Office of Naval Research (ONR). "For industry and innovators, the Framework focuses naval business decisions around common, clearly-defined priorities."

Having those priorities, and involving innovators in the discussion earlier, will increase the likelihood that a business product will make it to the finish line--i.e., increase the chances research will make it to full-

scale production.

"For industry, time is money," noted Jones. "This Framework will make doing business with the Navy and Marine Corps easier."

Meanwhile, members of the academic community will also get a first look at the Framework at the Future Force Expo. The outlined new priorities should help provide focus for academics in determining how research can better meet the needs of Sailors and Marines.

"The Framework recognizes the importance of enduring, basic research programs," said Dr. Lary Schuette, ONR's director of research. "However, it will also help the academic community to align various research efforts with the naval mission."

Taken together, the Framework for the first time represents a shift to a full-spectrum view of research, development and acquisition for the naval future force.



### Southern Partnership Station 2017 begins

MAYPORT, Fla. (NNS) -- U.S. Naval Forces Southern Command/U.S. 4th Fleet (USNAVSOUTH/FOURTHFLT) began Southern Partnership Station-Expeditionary Fast Transport 2017 (SPS-EPT 17) by deploying USNS Spearhead (T-EPF 1), Saturday, to Central and South America from July to late October 2017.

Southern Partnership Station is an annual series of U.S. Navy deployments focused on exchanges with regional partner nation militaries and security forces. This year's deployments will visit Guatemala, Honduras, Chile, and Colombia.

SPS-EPT 17 is a U.S. Southern Command (USSOUTHCOM) directed operation planned by Commander, U.S. Naval Forces Southern Command/U.S. 4th Fleet and carried out by deployed adaptive force packages (AFPs) under the direction of the Destroyer Squadron 40 staff.

Making this deployment possible is Spearhead, the first of the Spearhead-class expeditionary fast transport vessels, which are crewed and operated by civil service mariners, and serves as a platform for embarked military detachments to include AFPs.

AFPs are specialized teams of U.S. service members from the fields of engineering, force protection and medical.

One potential concern, according to Navy officials, is that the force of the collision may have warped the superstructure and created an alignment issue for the ship's SPY-1 radar. Fixing that could add an enormous sum to the repair bill and could even be cost-

Mattis said he will refine his request for additional U.S. troops in Afghanistan at that time.

Mattis wouldn't put a timeline on the conflict in Afghanistan.

"War is a fundamentally unpredictable phenomenon," he said. "Every attempt to create a pat answer ... is probably going to fail. The bottom line is NATO has made a commitment because the freedom from fear and terrorism ... demands this not be left undone."

Then-Sen. John Warner, R-Va., wrote up legislation to get the Navy the money it needed to fix the ship, Natter said.

Once the ship is in dry-dock, the Navy will complete a thorough assessment of what is wrong with the ship and will get estimates of how much it's going to cost. In the case of *Cole*, it cost the Navy

prohibitive, but those assessments haven't been completed yet.

Doss declined to comment on the alignment concerns, citing ongoing damage assessments and repair planning.

Just getting the ship out the water is a task in and of itself, said retired Capt. Gordan Van Hook, who was the chief engineer on frigate *Samuel B. Roberts* when it struck a mine in 1988.

"Every ship has a docking plan for when you go into dry dock," Van Hook said in a telephone interview. "It involves putting blocks underneath the keel to support the ship. But if large parts of the hull compromised or penetrated it can create a lot of loads and stresses that the ship wasn't meant to withstand and if you don't do it correctly you can bend the keel or damage the strakes."

That means the ship's docking plan needs to be redone to account for the damaged hull. Officials believe based on preliminary assessments that the keel of the *Fitz* made it through the collision ok. Fixing a broken keel would be another enormous cost driver, though the Navy managed to fix the *Sammy B*, which had a completely fractured keel.

Funding for the repairs would likely come from supplemental funding, said retired Adm. Robert Natter, who was the head of U.S. Fleet Forces Command when destroyer *Cole* was attacked by terrorists in Yemen and needed repair.

"The natural place for the Navy to go for the money for repairs would be the [Overseas Contingency Operations fund]," Natter said.

When the Navy had to pony up almost a quarter-of-a-billion dollars to fix *Cole*, the Navy tapped into a supplemental funding pot.

about \$250 million - or about two-and-a-half F-35s - to complete the repairs.

The most likely scenario for the repair is that the Navy will have to send *Fitz* home on a heavy-lift vessel, said Bryan Clark, a retired submariner and analyst with the Center for Strategic and Budgetary Assessments.

"There is no way they can get it repaired overseas," Clark said. "What they are doing now is trying to determine whether it can be repaired enough to make it home on its own power or if they should put it on a heavy-lift ship. From there it's going to go into a long repair period at one of the private yards."

*Cole* was taken to Ingalls shipyard in Pascagoula, Mississippi, where she was built, on board the Heavy Lift Ship *Blue Marlin*.

For *Cole*, Ingalls cut out the damaged section of the ship, re-fabricated the new section and welded it back into the ship. In all the repair replaced 550 tons of steel and both main engines, per a 2002 press release.

As for the ship's crew, they are returning to work gradually and beginning to get back to a normal routine, Doss said.

"The crew is resuming their normal routine incrementally - standing some in port watches as well as drydock preparations," Doss wrote. "Fitzgerald engineers are conducting the defueling process right now for example."

"The entire waterfront continues to support Fitzgerald Sailors and their families and I would stress that resuming their routine at a measured pace is an important part of the healing process."

## Social Security Matters

### Ask Rusty - Spousal benefits lost

*Dear Rusty: I took my Social Security at 62 since I had to stop working to care for my mom when I was 57. I was widowed at the time but remarried when I was 58 1/2 years old. I collected on my own work record, which was low. Why didn't I get half of my present husband's benefit when he started benefits at his full retirement age? I am 70 now. Will I get his full Social Security if he dies before me? Signed: Missing Benefits*

Dear Missing: Yours is an issue which we unfortunately see occasionally with folks who have been collecting their own benefits for a long time and later become entitled to more than they have been receiving. This situation arises with couples where the lower-earning spouse filed for Social Security before their higher-earning spouse applied. The lower-earning spouse (spouse#1) got benefits based upon their own work record only and received no spousal benefit because the higher-earning spouse (spouse#2) had not yet filed. Later on, when spouse#2 finally filed for benefits, spouse#1 became eligible for a "spousal boost" (if their spousal benefit was more than their own), but it did not happen automatically; that "spousal boost" had to be applied for when spouse #2 started benefits. Unfortunately many people didn't realize this, assuming that the benefit they received when they first filed is what they get for the rest of their life. They might also have assumed that Social Security automatically made the spousal adjustment for them, which wasn't the case. As a result, we find that some spouses have lost thousands of dollars in benefits, simply because they did not know they had to actually apply for spousal benefits when they became eligible for them. A similar situation might exist where someone who was single and already receiving benefits marries a higher-earning person already collecting Social Security benefits. Again in this case, spousal benefits must have been applied for to be received. Note that since the Bipartisan Budget Act of 2015 was enacted, everyone applying for Social Security is "deemed filing" for both their own and spousal benefits, but that doesn't mitigate this particular issue because both spouses applied for benefits prior to the new rules becoming effective.



In your specific case, you became eligible for your additional spousal benefit as soon as your present husband's benefits began. Assuming your husband is about the same age as you, if 1/2 of your husband's benefit at his full retirement age of 66 was more than your own benefit, this means that you have gone for about 4 years without receiving the added spousal benefits you are entitled to. So, the first thing you should do is to contact Social Security as soon as possible and apply for your spousal benefits (or do it online at ssa.gov). When you do this, be sure to make the effective date of those benefits 6 months prior to the date you file, because Social Security will pay you up to 6 months of retroactive benefits. Unfortunately, the remaining 3 1/2 years of the benefits you were entitled to but didn't claim may be lost. There is at least some chance, if your husband listed you as a spouse when he applied, that Social Security might give you more than six months retroactive, so you should make an appointment and explain what happened to see if anything more can be recovered.

As to your second question, yes, upon your husband's death you will receive 100 percent of the benefit he was receiving, instead of the benefit you are already receiving.

## Moving Vietnam Veterans Memorial Wall makes way to Desert Hot Springs

DESERT HOT SPRINGS, Calif. - In 1982, the Vietnam Veterans Memorial Wall was built and dedicated to those who served and died in the Vietnam War. While attending the dedication in 1982, a group of artists felt the positive power of The Wall and felt it should be shared not only in Washington D.C., but across the country. Sitting at about half the size of the actual Vietnam Veterans Memorial Wall, the two replicas began their journey in Tyler, Texas in 1984. Today, the walls travel across the country from April to November, to pay tribute to those who made the ultimate sacrifice.

The city of Desert Hot Springs hosted The Moving Wall at their local Mission Springs Park from June 22 to June 26, 2017.

During the Vietnam War more

than 58,000 service members, both men and women, were either killed or deemed missing in action. The Wall has the names of those men and women etched onto a reflective stone, so visitors can not only see the names, but see themselves, reflecting on the lives of the people who fought and died to keep them safe.

At the commencement of the program, Headquarters Battalion Color Guard posted their colors at the Moving Wall opening program and, the keynote speaker, retired Sgt. Frank Orzio, pastor, Wounded Warrior Ministry Project, addressed those in attendance.

"In this time of remembrance we must hold close to our hearts our fallen warriors, keep in our mind our prisoners of war and missing in action service members who have become a shadow of a memory," Orzio said. "We see these men and women and realize, once again, how much we owe them and how much they have given."

Following the program, lo-

cal community members were able to visit the wall and pay their respects. Also local Vietnam veterans attended to honor their fallen comrades, and pass knowledge to the younger generations at hand.

On June 26, Desert Hot Springs hosted the closing ceremony for the Moving Wall. It will now move onto a different location to spread the same spirit

of positivity; the same feeling of gratitude and respect that those artists felt from the dedication of the original wall in 1982.

"We wanted the Moving Wall here in Desert Hot Springs to give our veterans the chance to pay homage to those who lost their lives in the Vietnam War," said Requita Grant, event coordinator, Community and Cultural Affairs.

## New Web Tuition Assistance automation significantly speeds approval process

As part of the Navy's transformation to a virtual service delivery model, the Navy College Program launched an update to the My Education portal June 27, significantly improving the Web Tuition Assistance approval process for Sailors taking off-duty education courses.

"We've automated a major portion of the WebTA authorization process to improve accuracy, reduce the time it takes to complete the application, and get vouchers authorized," said Cathie Waters, Naval Education and Training Professional Development Center Voluntary Education (VOLED) lead program analyst. "Not only does the new process give commanding officers greater authority in the TA authorization process, the improvements will enable faster enrollments, grade posting, invoice payments, and make voluntary education less stressful for our Sailors."

Previously, Sailors had to wait for the Navy College staff to manually verify and authorize their WebTA applications after command approval. The new process automatically checks/validates the Academic Institution's (AI) course/tuition

information, validates a Sailor's status, including degree plan, counseling, no missing grades, EAOS status, TA annual usage, etc.

As part of the update, the My Education portal also adds an AI module where Sailors can select their courses/tuition rates and have those automatically uploaded to the WebTA voucher.

"If all Navy requirements are met, if the Sailor has used course and tuition information from AI module to populate the WebTA request, and if the request is command approved, then My Education automatically sends the service member a link to the school payment voucher for signing and delivery to the Academic Institution" Waters added.

"Our approval backlog for TA requests has averaged nearly five-hundred on any given day, each requiring manual review," said Lt. Cmdr. Nick Turner, NETPDC VOLED deputy director. "The new automated WebTA process will significantly reduce the backlog, allowing exceptionally quick turnaround."

In order for a Sailor to have

their WebTA request accepted and command approved, they need to meet specific training and policy requirements, (training completed, academic counseling by a Navy College Counselor, degree plan uploaded, passing the PRT, recommended for advancement, etc.) to qualify.

Mandatory training includes TA Policy and Procedures Training and the Joint Knowledge Online Higher Education Prep Course. Training can be found at the Navy College website under 'Resources' and 'Training.' Navy College Education Counselors also provide the required academic counseling to help Sailors define their goals and select an education program. Once a college/university and a program have been selected, Sailors work with their AI to produce an education plan which they upload to their 'My Education,' 'education tab,' and 'upload files' tab.

When all the above requirements have been met, Sailors are able to create, save, and submit their WebTA application, entering the Command Approver's e-mail address. WebTA applications that do not pass the automatic checks will be reviewed and manually processed by a Navy College Program staff member, requiring extra time to fix problems. WebTA requests

received prior to 27 June will continue to be manually processed until all are funded.

"As a final push to help eliminate the current WebTA queue, we will be concentrating efforts of the Navy College Virtual Education Center (NCVEC) staff on Friday June 30 and Monday July 3 for TA processing," said Turner. "On those days, live chat and help requests will still

be available for Sailors needing assistance. Normal VEC hours will resume July 5."

It is highly recommended that WebTA applications be submitted no later than 30 days in advance, but all WebTA applications MUST be command approved no later than 14 calendar days prior to an AI's published term start date. Applications may be submitted for approval

up to 120 days prior to term start dates.

## Navy to issue Letters of Intent for most Sailors' PCS moves

The Navy announced Friday in NAVADMIN 159/17 that beginning July 5, most Sailors will receive a Letter of Intent (LOI) that will help them coordinate a Permanent Change of Station (PCS) household good shipment much earlier, as well as complete other necessary screenings.

These mitigation efforts and innovative process changes will now allow most Sailors to complete operational (sea duty) screenings, update security clearances, take permissive Temporary Duty (TDY) to find a residence, and begin the entitlement counseling and application processes for the movement of Household Goods (HHG) before receiving funded orders.

"We understand the impact that compressed PCS lead times have had on Sailors and their families preparing to move,"

said Chief of Naval Personnel Vice Adm. Robert Burke. "That is why we have been working hard to develop and implement solutions within our control that minimize the impact to our Sailors. Our focus and priority remains on manning the Fleet, and taking care of Sailors and their families."

Previously, only Sailors receiving orders to an overseas duty location were issued LOIs to start the process of completing overseas and medical screenings, dependent entry approval, passport applications and security clearance requests. Now, most Sailors will receive an LOI.

"While we are working hard to ultimately provide Sailors six months of orders lead time, these are tangible changes that will help Sailors prepare for their upcoming move several months in advance," said Burke. "We believe these changes will enable greater flexibility and help alleviate some of the challenges of the already stressful situation associated with a PCS move."

Upon receipt of an LOI, Sailors should access the Defense Personal Property System (DPS), accessible through <http://www.move.mil>. If not in receipt of funded PCS orders, "NAVY-LOI" should be entered as the PCS order number to begin the process of shipping their HHG. When funding is received and PCS orders are issued, NPC will provide the HHG offices with a copy of the Sailor's PCS orders

for upload into DPS and send the moving request to industry. Additionally, Personnel Support Detachments can make reservations for travel with the LOI.

However, because an LOI does not contain a line of accounting, it cannot be used to issue tickets, receive advanced military and/or travel pay, ship HHGs and Privately Owned Vehicles (POV) or place them in storage, or used to reimburse for a personally procured move.

While most Sailors will receive an LOI for their PCS orders, the following types of orders are not eligible to receive one: Temporary Limited Duty (TLD), Home Port Changes, Pre Commission units, Expeditionary Combat Readiness Center (ECRC), Afghanistan-Pakistan (AFPAK) Hands, pregnancies, accessions, retirements and separations. These types of orders have defined release timelines well in advance, making an LOI unnecessary.

Service members are encouraged to visit <https://www.navsup.navy.mil/household/> for the schedule of Household Goods Entitlement Webinars and other valuable information. This website or the local Personal Property Office will provide families with detailed instructions on completing the online household goods move application. Commands are requested to proactively encourage members to begin the HHG move application process as early as possible.

Commander Navy Installations Command (CNIC) provides the following reminders to facilitate other aspects of PCS move planning:

Those Sailors applying for Navy family housing can be placed on the housing waitlist according to the date of detachment from the Sailor's prior permanent duty station based on their PCS orders, provided that a housing application is submitted within 30 days of the reporting date. Advance applications will be accepted. However, placement on the list will not occur until the Sailor reports to the gaining Command. This ensures Navy family housing waitlists





first step to securing financial aid for college, including federal student loans, and most state and institutional aid. Unfortunately, many students don't realize they are eligible for such aid, leaving tons of money (and potential educational opportunities) on the table. To complete the FAFSA, visit [fafsa.ed.gov](http://fafsa.ed.gov).

- Search for Scholarships. Because scholarship money typically does not have to be repaid, it's important to secure as much of it as possible. Begin your search using online scholarship databases, such as TuitionFundingSources.com, and meet with your school counselor to discuss other available scholarship opportunities. Micro-scholarships are another option to consider. Check out sites like [raise.me](http://raise.me) to learn more about how you can earn scholarship money for your high school achievements.

- Understand Family Finances. Now is the time to have some

are independent of orders receipt date.

Housing also provides a tool that allows Sailors and their families to engage with Housing Service Center staff at one or more Navy installations worldwide earlier in the PCS process. The Housing Early Assistance Tool (HEAT) can be accessed at <http://www.cnmc.navy.mil/HEAT>, even before PCS orders are issued. No CAC is required to access the website.

Additionally, MilitaryChild-Care.com provides a single online gateway for families to access military-operated or military-subsidized child care options worldwide across all Services. Due to the standardized request process and waitlist management tools, the DoD site offers a more streamlined approach for finding and requesting care and providing An-

icipated Placement Time (APT) estimates. This allows families to submit requests for care at programs with an APT that most closely fulfills their needs. Since APT estimates may change, families are advised to review all their options on a regular basis and submit requests for all DoD child care operations that may meet their requirements.



# AutoMatters & More: Demolition Derby – ‘It’s Ten Times Better Than Jumping Out of an Airplane!’

Thrilling, action-packed motorsports are an annual tradition at the San Diego County Fair. In demolition derby a group of loud, flame-belching, beat-up junker cars entertain cheering fans by crashing into each other, over and over again. The wet, muddy track allows the competitors to build up just enough speed to make the mayhem interesting. The goal of each driver is to win by disabling the other cars without rendering their own car immobile, and therefore be driving the last car still moving.

Officials with fire extinguishers, flags and loud air horns stand atop the dirt berms that surround the track in the Del Mar Arena.

The competitors are not in this to make money. Even winning an event does not cover the required expenses, much less justify the risk to

life and limb, so why do they spend their time and money to buy, equip and then smash up cars?

Mauricio De Kara of De Lara Towing explained it this way: “It’s only \$1,500 if you win first place. It’s not the money that we go for, it’s really for fun and bragging rights – the one who hits harder, who rolls the car or anything like that. We’ve been around for a long time, and we like to go and give a show. My uncles and my brothers have been doing this since the early 60s – a family tradition in Indio, California. In Coachella, Riverside County – we always used to go to Indio Fairgrounds. WGAS had a show over there. We follow them wherever they go do shows anywhere else. We go to San Diego, we go to Blythe, Perris, Imperial and Utah sometimes. At local shows we sponsor up to seven or eight cars. Robert Hernandez is my nephew.”

In Del Mar, Robert drove a 1972 Chevy Impala. He built it over five months, spending a considerable amount of money and many hours away from family and friends, in anticipation of competing in the fair’s demolition derby.

“It is the most exhilarat-

ing sport I’ve ever done. The rush is insane. It’s ten times better than jumping out of an airplane.”

“First you focus on safety. I built a roll cage and focused on the steering. I make the car really strong, welding whatever I need to as far as plates around the car. Then I focus on the drivetrain and moving the car.”

Assuming all the labor is free, how much in parts and materials are we looking at to prepare one of these cars to the rules? “You’ve got \$2,000 in metal just to make it safe and strong. Then you have another \$2000 for tires and rims. You’ve got transmission coolers, the shifter and a safer steering column so it can collapse in case the front end goes up. The driveshaft is another \$600. The fuel cell has to be five to six gallons, and cannot be composed of any plastics whatsoever – so you’ve got stainless steel back there. The radiator is another \$200 – \$100 maybe. The newer motor you get that’s rebuilt, you’re probably looking at about four grand, five grand maybe. It’s not a requirement to have a fire suit or a fire extinguisher, but I do have a fire extinguisher just in case something goes south, you know.”

How much of this can be transferred to another car, when this one is smashed beyond recognition? “It depends on how bad it is smashed inside. It’s going to take just as many hours removing the metal that it took to put the metal in – another solid month of hours and hours after work, no weekend funds or anything like that, and just removing all parts.”

How did he get involved? “My uncles, they’ve owned a

towing company. Growing up, every year we’d go out to the fair and watch them, and every year they’d get stronger and better. As a kid, eight years old and nine years old, I remember playing in the dirt and grabbing my Hot Wheels cars and smashing them together because I thought it was cool. As soon as I could, when I turned 18, I did my first demolition derby; my second when I was 19. I stopped because I moved. This is my first year

back. I’m 32.”

Robert is looking forward to many more years of demolition derby. So are we.

## Navy Reserve aircrew saves structures and wildlife on San Clemente Island

SAN DIEGO - Navy Reserve Aircrew Sailors assigned to Helicopter Sea Combat Squadron (HSC) 3 recently aided the San Clemente Island Federal Fire Department in fighting wildfires on San Clemente Island.

"We were airborne with our buckets in minutes, and we slipped right into the effort with the Federal Fire Department and civilian air assets already on station," said Cmdr. Eric Bernsen, a Navy Reserve pilot who flew in the firefighting mission.

The fire started June 26 from ordnance dropped during normal range operations, causing no damage to structures, utilities, or injuries to people, according to reports.

Attached to the HSC-3 Southern California Offshore Range (SCORE) detachment, the four-member aircrew teams consisted of five Navy Reservists, working alongside three active duty aircrewmen, who manned two MH-60S helicopters. The helicopters carrying

324 gallons of water each were launched to help with firefighting efforts that began early Monday morning.

Co-pilots, Bernsen and Lt. Cmdr. Matthew Stender, Search and Rescue Crewman, Aviation Warfare Specialist 2nd Class Kenneth Bell, and helicopter aircraft commanders, Lt. Cmdr. Paul Kramer and Lt. Cmdr. Dean Halton, rely on their readiness and training specifically for responses like this.

"Reservists embody the true meaning of Citizen Sailor," said Cmdr. Renee May, HSC-3 SCORE detachment commanding officer. "One day they are embedded in the Southern California community as a firefighter, police officer, drone designers, airplane mechanics, teachers, attorneys, mothers and fathers - the next day they are trusted experts in the Navy responding to real missions."

The aircrew performed normal Reserve duty requirements when the call came in to respond. The teams dropped more than 30,000 gallons of water using "monsoon buckets," large collapsible

buckets made for firefighting, to contain the fire.

Nearly 12 hours and 93 drops concluded the efforts of aircrews that ultimately resulted in containing the fire from damaging nearby communication equipment and preventing damage to the endangered plant species on the island.

"The actions and performance of the HSC-3 SCORE detachment highlights the accomplishments and professionalism of a true Total Force team," said Capt. Mike Mineo, commodore of Maritime Support Wing. "Successful firefighting requires practice and a good crew front to back. The aircrew executed the drops with precision, providing constant feedback to the pilots after each pass. If the drop is too low, you fan the flames. If the drop is too high and fast, the water never hits the fire. We're very proud of everyone involved."

HSC-3 is a multi-role combat helicopter squadron stationed at NAS North Island.

# Nimitz commemorates Battle of Leyte Gulf

 SURIGAO STRAIT (NNS) -- The aircraft carrier USS Nimitz (CVN 68) conducted a Battle of Leyte Gulf Commemoration Ceremony on the ship's fantail as it passed through the Surigao Strait, July 3.

The Battle of Surigao Strait was fought between the United States, and its allied forces, against Japan from Oct. 23-26, 1944. The battle was one of two battleship-to-battleship campaigns in the Pacific during World War II.

"Today we sail the same waters as those Sailors did 73 years ago," said Cmdr. J.W. David Kurtz, Nimitz' executive officer (XO). "While the immediate dangers may not be the same, the outcome of combat at sea has not changed."

Nimitz payed tribute with remarks from the ship's XO, a moment of silence, 21-gun salute, and the playing of "Taps" during the morning ceremony. In the afternoon, Nimitz held the Surigao 5K on the flight deck.

"The ceremony this morning shed light and painted a picture

of the historic battle," said Nimitz Information Systems Technician 3rd Class Matt Apodaca, a native of Pueblo West, Colorado. "The 5K was also the perfect way to pay tribute to those Sailors who sacrificed so much, and allowed me the opportunities I have today."

The battle of Leyte Gulf, in which the Battle of Surigao Strait is included, is assessed to be the largest naval battle of World War II, and possibly the largest in history.

"Proud. Emotional. Motivated. I'm proud to be here at the ceremony because they didn't have to give their lives for us, but they did," said Chief Religious Program Specialist Kimberly Bell, from Tampa Florida and a member of Nimitz' religious ministries department. "This ceremony was emotional for me because every time they play taps I want to cry when I think about all that those service members sacrificed for us. It's motivating to see an event like this because of what they did and accomplished in the battle and how it affected the war."

When it was over, the United States Navy had lost roughly

3,000 Sailors and Marines, one light carrier and two escort carriers, while the Japanese navy had lost roughly 12,500 sailors, one fleet carrier and three light carriers, a loss they could not recover from.

"Today, as we carry on the necessary business of life at sea, I ask you to pause for just a moment to pay tribute to our predecessors who went before us, and remain here today, their names remembered mainly in records, but their spirit ever eternal," said Kurtz.



## America Amphibious Readiness Group to depart for scheduled deployment

SAN DIEGO - Sailors and Marines from the America Amphibious Ready Group (ARG) and 15th Marine Expeditionary Unit (MEU) will depart their homeport of Naval Base San Diego, Friday, July 7, for a regularly scheduled deployment.

America ARG is comprised of amphibious assault ship USS America (LHA 6), amphibious transport dock USS San Diego (LPD 22), and amphibious dock landing ship USS Pearl Harbor (LSD 52). During deployment they will operate with embarked forces of the 15th MEU, Amphibious Squadron (PHIBRON) 3, the "Wildcards" of Helicopter Sea Combat Squadron (HSC) 23, and detachments from Assault Craft Unit 5, Naval Beach Group 1, Beachmaster Unit 1, Fleet Surgical Team 1 and Tactical Air Control Squadron 11.

While deployed, the America ARG/15th MEU team will operate in the Pacific, Middle East, and the Horn of Africa, conducting maritime security operations, crisis response capability, theater security cooperation and forward naval presence.

"It has been incredible to see the America ARG/15th MEU team come together as a highly capable, lethal, and ready force," said Capt. Rome Ruiz, commander, PHIBRON 3. "Not only did they excel at ARG-MEU integration and amphibious warfare, they spearheaded an environment of innovation and dominated the battle space in the training phases by leveraging the unique characteristics of the America ARG as an up-gunned, aviation-centric task force. I have every confidence that we will succeed on deployment."

The 15th MEU is commanded by Col. Joseph Clearfield and consists of the Command Element; the Aviation Combat Element, Marine Medium Tiltrotor Squadron 161 (Reinforced); the Ground Combat Element, 1st Battalion, 5th Ma-

"We have trained exceptionally



"Our partnership with the Vietnam People's Navy continues to grow stronger each year," said Capt. Alexis T. Walker, commodore, Destroyer Squadron 7. "We're excited to have the opportunity to work alongside our partners here in Vietnam and build off the success of last year's

engagement."

In addition to USS Coronado and USNS Salvor, U.S. units participating in Naval Engagement Activity Vietnam include personnel from Task Force 73, Destroyer Squadron 7, and the U.S. 7th Fleet Band.

"These naval activities underscore the deepening and diverse relationship between the United States and Vietnam. Our security cooperation was an important discussion point during the recent meeting between President Trump and Prime Minister Nguyen Xuan Phuc," noted U.S. Ambassador to Vietnam Ted Osius.

This year marks the 22nd anniversary of the normalization of diplomatic relations between the United States and Vietnam. NEAs were designed to foster mutual understanding, build confidence in the maritime domain, and develop relationships between the people and navies of both nations.

Commander, Task Force 73 and Destroyer Squadron 7 staff conduct advanced planning, organize resources and directly support the execution of NEA Vietnam, in addition to maritime exercises such as the bilateral Cooperation Afloat Readiness and Training (CARAT) series and the multilateral Southeast Asia Cooperation and Training (SEACAT) with Bangladesh, Brunei, Cambodia, Indonesia, Malaysia, the Philippines, Singapore and Thailand.

This five-day collaboration will focus on events and skills exchanges in diving and salvage and undersea medicine. A brief at-sea phase will allow ships from both navies to practice the Code for Unplanned Encounters at Sea (CUES), ship handling, and medical evacuations. Subject matter expert exchanges ashore will focus on shipboard damage control, shipboard medicine, and law. NEA will also feature formal office calls, band concerts, community relations events, and team sports.

"The United States values our comprehensive partnership with Vietnam and we look forward to deepening our relationship and people-to-people ties through engagements like NEA," said Rear Adm. Don Gabrielson, commander, Task Force 73. "By working and interacting together regularly we foster meaningful relationships and trust between our nations that contribute to the peace and prosperity of the region."

This is the first time the event is being held in Khanh Hoa Province and the eighth iteration of NEA Vietnam since it was established as an annual engagement in 2010.

### New San Diego ship arrives: USS Gabrielle Giffords (LCS 10)

The USS Gabrielle Giffords (LCS 10), the U.S. Navy's newest littoral combat ship arrived in her homeport at Naval Base San Diego for the first time on Wednesday, July 5.

The ship was commissioned in Galveston, Texas last month after completing construction in Mobile, Alabama.

According to the Navy, the USS Giffords is the ninth littoral combat ship in the fleet. The ship joins the USS Freedom (LCS 1), USS Independence (LCS 2), USS Fort Worth (LCS 3), USS Coronado (LCS 4), USS Jackson (LCS 6), and USS Montgomery (LCS 8) as LCS ships based in San Diego.

The ship is named after former Arizona Congresswoman Gabrielle Giffords who survived an assassination attempt in 2011.

Former SecNav Ray Mabus chose the name for the ship, saying Giffords' name was "synonymous with courage when she inspired the nation with remarkable resiliency and showed the possibilities of the human spirit."

# Inbox: Who has best shot at top rotation slot?

## Padres beat reporter AJ Cassavell answers fans' questions

After seeing Luis Perdomo, Dinelson Lamet and Miguel Diaz, which of the three has the best chance of becoming a top-of-the-rotation arm?

-- Eduardo L., San Diego

The Padres' aging rotation got young quickly this season, due to a handful of injuries. As a result, Perdomo, Lamet and Diaz were all given the chance to showcase the bright futures ahead of them.

Right now, Diaz is simply too raw to make any bold projections. Perdomo is furthest along in his development. His sinker/slider mix makes him a bona fide middle-of-the-rotation candidate for years to come.

Lamet, on the other hand, has bigger holes. His command can be shoddy, and he needs to learn to pitch more efficiently. But his stuff is ace-caliber. Lamet debuted in May with three above-

average Major League pitches, two of which could become elite. Of the three young right-handers, Lamet has the best chance to sit atop the rotation one day.

What are the chances the Padres deal Brad Hand and Brandon Maurer by Aug. 1, making way for Phil Maton to become the closer?

-- Matt

Lots of assumptions here. The first is a fair one. Hand is the Padres' most coveted trade chip ahead of the non-waiver Trade Deadline, and it's hard to see his value being any higher than it is now. It seems more likely than not that Hand is dealt before July 31.

Maurer, meanwhile, has been inconsistent at best, with an ERA north of 6. It's doubtful the Padres would receive much for Maurer, making it prudent to hang onto the hard-throwing right-hander (who they feel has closer-caliber stuff).

Then there's Maton, who has been undeniably impressive since his callup last month. He's destined to become a closer candidate in the future. But even if Maurer is dealt (and he won't be), Maton wouldn't usurp Ryan Buchter or Kirby Yates, who both are in the midst of impressive seasons.

Who will be the first 2016

Padres Draft pick to debut, and when?

-- Mark B., Poway

Out of everyone from the 2017 Draft class, who do you think will make the MLB roster first?

-- Jason F.

I'm sensing a trend: Padres fans looking to the future. And understandably so, given the talent haul of their past two Draft classes. (These questions are also particularly relevant with Maton as the first 2015 draftee to make it to San Diego.)

Let's start with the 2016 group. Cal Quantrill is the top prospect, at No. 2 in the system and No. 83 overall. But in his progression, he's slightly behind left-handers Eric Lauer and Joey Lucchesi -- both of whom were promoted to Double-A San Antonio last week. Between the two, I'll take Lauer, who tossed 7 2/3 scoreless frames while striking out nine in his Double-A debut Sunday. A September callup is probably a stretch for Lauer. But with his advanced four-pitch mix, 2018 seems very likely.

As for the 2017 class, it's anyone's guess. The Padres took six high schoolers in a row to open the Draft, and prep prospects are notoriously unpredictable. That said, top pick MacKenzie Gore has all the tools to be placed on the fast track. Sure, he's only 18, but he's as safe a bet as any to debut by the '19 season.

When will Allen Cordoba play consistently at shortstop?

-- Jared W., Las Vegas

It's not going to happen this year. The Padres have spoken repeatedly about easing the burden on Cordoba, a Rule 5 Draft selection who had never played a game above Rookie ball until Opening Day. Already, Cordoba has played in more games this season than he's played in any other professional campaign.

Cordoba exceeded expectations early, but the grind of a Major League season has clearly started to wear on him. I'd argue that playing every day at shortstop -- an extremely demanding position -- might actually be detrimental to his development. He should continue to see time there once or twice a week in the second half.



The Spreckels Organ in San Diego is the world's largest outdoor pipe organ. Obscured the Big Picture and Nearly Resulted in a Missed Buried Deposit in La Jolla, California Saturday, July 22, 2017, at 7:30 pm at Los Peñasquitos Adobe, Los Peñasquitos Canyon Preserve, Off Black Mountain Road, beyond Canyonside Community Park Archaeologist Richard Schultz. For many years small excavation units have been utilized to gain understanding of the contents and contexts of sediments below the sod and streets of La Jolla Shores. However, add to this a 1920s grading operation, professional experiences with previously undocumented fill profiles, and small excavation unit archaeology, and it almost missed the big picture--until a recent recovery-oriented excavation program exposed sediment profiles that were not what they were presumed to have been. 

# Therapy dog brightens lives

When Sajek, the Sexual Assault Prevention Response Office's first therapy dog was medically retired here last year, Amy Creighton began the search for a new dog.

"After speaking with several organizations, we decided to work with Warrior's Best Friend. That group then began their search for the perfect dog for our program, and after several long months of waiting, Apollo was brought into their program from a local shelter," said Creighton, who is the Missouri Air National Guard, 131st Bomb Wing's sexual assault response coordinator.

Apollo attended training for several months learning commands, Creighton said. Along with all of his "good citizen" commands such as "sit, stay, down, shake," she said, Apollo has also been trained on more trauma specific commands, such as "block."

Blocking, she said, is a command given when a person needs a physical barrier between them and a crowd or another person to feel safe.

After Apollo graduated in



May, he and Creighton have worked together at the SAPR office here.

Since Apollo came into training from a shelter, Creighton was given the opportunity of choosing a name for him.

"I wanted a strong name that conveyed his mission within the SAPR office," Creighton said. "It took a little time, but we decided on Apollo, which was the name of the Greek god of medicine, light, and healing. We hope he will bring light and healing to everyone he has contact with."

Apollo is a trained therapy dog, not to be confused with a fully trained service dog. There are several differences between the two, but the most significant difference is a service dog is matched to work with one

person performing specific tasks for that person each day. A therapy dog, like Apollo, is trained with the purpose of serving and helping multiple people that may need his time and love.

"Therapy dogs like Apollo offer time, comfort, and an unconditional and nonjudgmental love that people who have been victimized often feel they cannot receive from a human in that moment," said Bethany Harris, the 131st Bomb Wing's director of psychological health. "Multiple studies have shown that sitting with or petting a dog lowers blood pressure, lifts spirits, slows down a person's heart rate and has an overall calming effect."


According to Creighton, Apollo's mission is to be one of many "tools" in the toolbox of resources that the SAPR office has to offer survivors of sexual assault. There is no "one-size-fits-all" approach to working with victims of this crime, and the SAPR office's goal is to offer as many options as possible to help victims onto their own personal path to healing and becoming a survivor.

Sajek now enjoys a new role as a family dog in Creighton's home.

"I don't think Sajek considers himself retired, really," Creighton said. "Although he no longer travels into work with me each morning, it brings the whole family a great deal of comfort knowing that he will be waiting with his tail wagging to greet us when we get home each night."






