Navy commissions USS Cincinnati
Newest LCS to be homeported in San Diego

GULFPORT, Miss. - The Navy commissioned Independence-variant littoral combat ship USS Cincinnati (LCS 20) during a ceremony Saturday, Oct. 5.

More than 1,400 guests attended the ceremony for the fifth ship in naval service named for Cincinnati, the third-largest city in Ohio.

"From acquisition to construction, to testing and certification, she is a marvel of engineering that will extend our capabilities for any mission, from the middle of the ocean, to the shallowest of waters, enhancing our ability to project power at shore and at sea," said principle speaker U.S. Rep. Brad Wenstrup of Ohio.

"USS Cincinnati will extend the maneuverability and lethality of our fleet to confront the many challenges of our complex world."

Guest speakers for the event included U.S. Rep. Steven Palazzo of Mississippi, who discussed the dedication of the ship builders and the Sailors, and Commander, Allied Joint Force Command Naples/Commander, U.S. Naval Forces Europe/Commander, U.S. Naval Forces Africa, Adm. James G. Foggo III.

"Each and every day, our ships sail alongside those of our Allies and partners, defending freedom, deterring aggression, and ensuring adherence to the rules which underwrite the greatest signal to our allies and our partners and best warning to our adversaries" said Foggo. "Naval presence is essential to our National Defense Strategy and to a peaceful, connected,

and prosperous world."

Cincinnati Commander Officer, Cmdr. Jedediah Kloppel, reported to Foggo that the ship was ready and in his command. In addition, Penny Pritzker, the 38th U.S. Secretary of Commerce and the ship's sponsor, gave the traditional order to "man our ship and bring her to life!"

U.S. officials confirm North Korean submarine launched ballistic missile test

THE PENTAGON - The Democratic People's Republic of Korea test-fired what it claims is a new type of submarine-launched ballistic missile, though Pentagon officials and other experts say there's a long way to go before North Korea has a credible sea-based nuclear deterrent.

"The Academy of Defense Science of the Democratic People's Republic of Korea succeeded in test-firing the new-type SLBM Pukguksong-3 in the waters off Wonsan Bay of the East Sea of Korea on Oct. 2," according to an account posted by the North Korean-based state-run Korea Central News Agency (KCNA). "The new-type ballistic missile was fired in vertical mode."

The new missile type was fired from a submarine, according to the Department of Defense. Pentagon officials are still analyzing the launch data available to determine the type of missile fired, but for now do not think it was an intercontinental missile.

"We assessed it was a short-medium range ballistic missile," Air Force Col. Patrick Ryder, a Joint Staff spokesman, said during a media briefing Oct. 3. "We have no indication that it was launched from a submarine, but rather a sea-based platform."

The North Koreans have developed submersible barges for testing. Pyongyang proclaimed the test a success that will advance the nation's defenses against what it considers a hostile neighborhood.

"The successful new-type SLBM test-firing comes to be of great significance as it ushered in a new phase in containing the outside forces' threat to the DPRK and further bolstering its military muscle for self-defense," according to the KCNA post.

Port of San Diego Harbor Police warns public not to fall victim to 'spoof' calls


The Port of San Diego Harbor Police Department has received numerous reports that someone calling from (619) 686-6272, the Harbor Police non-emergency line, had demanded they send money via a money order to pay fines and prevent an arrest warrant from being issued. The caller told the potential victims to Google the phone number to verify the call was from a police agency.

These phone calls were not made by Harbor Police or any of its personnel and is part of a phone scam where the Harbor Police phone number was "spoofed." The process of "spoofing" shows a false number on the receiving person's caller ID. Harbor Police staff informed all those who called in that the call was not legitimate, and to disregard it.

Neither Harbor Police nor any other police agency will request funds by e-mail or telephone. Police agencies also will never request a money order or any other type of payment over the phone to prevent a warrant from being issued as such matters are handled as fines in court proceedings or official mail correspondence.

Harbor Police is investigating the incident and has notified the FBI. No suspects have been identified at this time and it is unknown at this time if anyone has been victimized by this scam.

Navy F/A-18C Hornet makes final active-duty flight

NORFOLK, Va. - The last Navy F/A-18C Hornet, aircraft number 300, made its official final active-duty flight at Naval Air Station Oceana, Oct. 2.

Assigned to Strike Fighter Squadron (VFA) 106 at Cecil Field, Florida, aircraft number 300 completed its first Navy acceptance check flight Oct. 14, 1988. Lt. Andrew Jalali, who piloted the Hornet for its final active-duty flight at Naval Air Station Oceana, was also born in 1988.

"Today marked the final United States Navy F/A-18C Operational Hornet flight," said the Commodore, Command Strike Fighter Wing Atlantic, Capt. Brian Becker.

The aircraft has remained with the Gladiators for its entire 31-years of service. The aircraft took off from NAS Oceana accompanied by three F/A-18F Super Hornets for a one-and-a-half hour flight and return to Oceana where it will be officially stricken from the inventory, stripped of all its usable parts and be scrapped.

Becker said the F/A-18C aircraft has served admirably for over 30 years and highlighted its history in naval aviation.

"Its technological innovation was continued on the F/A-18 E/F/G aircraft and helped the U.S. Navy transition from 4th to 5th generation aircraft," said Becker.

During the last year, VFA-106 has transferred over 50 F/A-18 Hornets to various Navy Reserve and U.S. Marine aviation commands, as well as, being placed in preservation for future use if needed.

Both the F/A-18A and F/A-18C Hornet variants have been replaced by the updated F/A-18E/F Super Hornets.

VFA-106 is the Navy's East Coast Fleet Replacement Squadron, which trains naval aviators to fly the F/A-18 Super Hornets.

NATO's new strategy will better protect Europe, commander says

The top U.S. military commander in Europe says the U.S. military will have a more productive role in NATO as a means of protecting Europe against two basic threats: Russia's "malign influence" and international terrorism.

Air Force Gen. Tod D. Wolters, NATO's supreme allied commander for Europe and commander of U.S. European Command, told Pentagon reporters Oct. 3 that continuing to support NATO by promoting democratic values is the key to defending Europe and deterring aggression.

"And as we support NATO with that number one priority, we are promoting those value systems. And it's very, very important that we stay tied to that," he said.

As for deterring aggression in Europe, Wolters said that means countering Russian

malign influence. "And, as you talk about countering Russian malign influence, you go back to the value system that we promote."

To counter Russia, the U.S. is a big advocate of building military relationships with

NATO nations - there are 29 - and other nation partners through personal relationships and readiness exercises, he said.

One of the good news stories is that NATO now has its own military strategy, he

said, something they didn't have for the last 50-plus years. "We did not have a document that the military arm that represents NATO could follow in order to apply a strategy," he said.

That strategy, which was endorsed by the North Atlantic Council, allows the U.S. military to have a more productive role within NATO and identifies two basic threats: Russia's status as a near-peer competitor and international terrorism, he said.

NATO has also implemented a "command structure adaptation," which means forces are placed in Europe wherever they are needed to better deter potential conflict, wherever that might be anticipated.

Although Europe is the primary focus, Wolters also said he is in consults regularly with his counterparts in other combatant commands to ensure the right balance of forces in the places they're needed most.

Trump takes steps to ensure safety of U.S. special operators in Syria

President Donald J. Trump has ordered the U.S. military to withdraw about 50 special operators from an area in Syria that may be an avenue for a Turkish incursion into the country.

The president addressed the move during a meeting with DOD leaders at the White House Oct. 8. He spoke to reporters following the meeting.

"We've been in Syria for a long time, and it was supposed to be a very short hit ... on ISIS," he said. "It didn't work out that way. They never left, and they've been there for many, many years. ... We were down to very few Soldiers in Syria. We had 50 in the region, ... and they've been already moved out."

Turkish President Recep Erdogan has threatened an incursion into Kurdish-controlled territory in Syria for months. He says the area shelters Kurds who have launched attacks into his country. The Defeat-ISIS coalition has been allied with Syrian Democratic Forces, and those indigenous forces were the hammer that ended the physical ISIS caliphate.

The SDF is about evenly split between Arabs and Kurdish forces. SDF officials said there are about 36,000 in the group.

Trump said he advised Erdogan to "treat everybody with great respect."

Esper, service secretaries talk privatized housing reform

Defense Secretary Dr. Mark T. Esper and the secretaries of the Army, Navy and Air Force met with privatized housing project owners at the Pentagon Oct. 2 to discuss the status of actions being taken to reform the delivery of privatized housing under the Military Housing Privatization Initiative.

Defense officials said that the secretaries reinforced their commitment to working with MHPI partners to ensure resident concerns are addressed in a responsive, timely and professional manner, with an emphasis on potential health or safety issues. They also recognized the need for more consistent affirmation of military families' rights as residents of privatized housing, which, the officials noted, will be underscored in the soon-to-be-released MHPI Resident Bill of Rights.

The group discussed progress made on the collective actions established by the department and the partners to address concerns raised by some residents in MHPI housing, defense officials said.

These actions include:

- Establishing a resident bill of rights and common lease framework;
- Increasing transparency and reporting of service work orders;
- Enhancing ongoing oversight and leader engagement on the program; and
- Improving communication with residents at all levels.

One element of improved communication is already underway - expanding the role of installation leaders for resident advocacy and dispute resolution, the defense officials noted.

The officials said the secretaries collectively share a commitment to ensure safe, high quality and affordable housing

and communities where service members and their families will want - and choose - to live.

MHPI is the largest and one of the most mature public-private partnership efforts in DOD, officials said. The initiative has improved family housing on military installations in the U.S., they noted. There are about 80 privatized projects encompassing more than 204,000 units located on more than 150 installations.

Privatization was the right thing to do, defense officials

said. It addressed DOD's \$20 billion maintenance backlog by leveraging private sector expertise and funding at a rapid pace, the officials said. It achieved more than \$32 billion in private development with about \$4 billion in DOD contributions, they said.

Privatized housing occupancy averaged 93 percent over the last three years, defense officials added, which they said indicates that military families are choosing on-base privatized housing over off-base private sector choices.

Navy Family eLearning now available

WASHINGTON - The Navy just made it easier for Navy spouses to learn all they need to navigate their way through the Navy in the palm of their hand.

The Navy Family eLearning was released on Tuesday, Oct 1, through the Commander, Navy Installations Command (CNIC) Learning Management System (LMS). The CNIC LMS is in support of the Navy Family Framework 2.0 (NFF).

The framework speaks to the diversity of Navy families and addresses how the Navy can best enable families to support the mission and see themselves as part of its strength, making a positive contribution.

Prior to the release of Navy Family eLearning the Navy Family Framework Governance Board met at CNIC headquarters Sept 23. The Fleet and Family Support Program updated the board on the Spouse eLearning Continuum, accessible through the CNIC Learning Management System called the Navy Family Portal.

"The Navy Family portal contains Navy Family Handbook, Navy Spouse Library, New Spouse Orientation, and Live Well Resiliency Webinars," said Shauna Turner, Director of Navy Family Programs. "eSolution was designed with the Navy family in mind, to include parents, friends, siblings and partners."

Turner went on to discuss that there is no one size fits all for the delivery of the information.

"The eSolution (Navy Family eLearning) contains delivery components which appeal to all generations of the Navy family," she said. "The components of the eSolution were developed specifically with mobile devices in mind since our metrics tell us that Navy families are increasing accessing information in this manner."

Navy Family eLearning offers the following:

- The Navy Family eHandbook, an Interactive Electronic Magazine;
- The Navy Spouse eLibrary, a one-stop shop with information for various stages of the military lifecycle;
- The New Spouse Orientation to assist and integrate new spouses into the Navy family through the lens of a company's new employee orientation; and
- The Live Well Resiliency Webinars, bringing the classroom so members of the military family can connect with service members and families from around the globe in the comfort of their home, office or location of your choice.

Also, OPNAV N17 briefed the working group on the MyNavy Family App, Spouse Licensure Reimbursement, and the MyPCS App. Navy Housing and USAA Educational Foundation (USAA-EF) briefed the status on Navy Housing and financial services video platforms, respectively.



VA refunds \$400 million in mistaken home loan fees

Veterans Affairs officials have paid out more than \$400 million in refunds of home loan funding fees in the wake of an inspector general's report that tens of thousands of veterans were improperly tagged with extra costs when applying for the loans.

Department officials said they reviewed 130,000 cases over the summer to look for errors, which mostly involved simple clerical mistakes or disability ratings changes after veterans settled on their loans.

Under existing rules, veterans and service members must pay a VA funding fee when they apply for a VA home loan, with costs between 0.5 percent and 3.3 percent of total money lent.

The money is designed to defray some administration costs for the department, but disabled veterans are exempt from the fee.

However, an inspector general report released earlier this year found that at least 53,000 disabled veterans had been charged the fees in recent years. VA officials announced in May they would review current and past loans, and contact veterans eligible for refunds.

In a statement, VA Secretary Robert Wilkie said the effort stretched back as far as 20 years ago. "Our administration prioritized fixing the problems and paid veterans what they were owed."

The payout total was significantly above the nearly \$290 million total investigators estimated

earlier this year. Those refunds ranged from a few thousand dollars to more than \$20,000 for some individuals.

VA officials also announced a new policy guidance for lenders to ensure they are asking veterans applying for the loans about their disability status, and establishing new internal processes for oversight over future loan applications which may qualify for waived fees.

"When we make a connection and have a real talk, the veterans become interested in their VA health care, PTSD counseling, getting sober and coming back to the world," Stoneman said. "Leo's a big part of saving these veterans' lives."

Ask Rusty - Will my husband's income affect my benefits?

Dear Rusty: Since it looks like a good option for me to retire at 62 and my husband (who is younger than me) to retire at 67, will the income he makes after I retire affect my benefit amount by way of income taxes if we continue to file jointly? Also, how would receiving an inheritance affect my benefit amount if I file at 62 Signed: Worried Spouse

Dear Worried: Your husband's income won't directly affect your monthly Social Security benefit payments at all, but it may affect the tax liability on your Social Security benefits. Only earnings from you working will affect your monthly Social Security benefits, but whether the benefits you receive become taxable income to the IRS depends upon the level of your "combined income" for your IRS filing status. "Combined income" is your Adjusted Gross Income (AGI) as reported to the IRS, plus any non-taxable interest you may have, plus 50 percent of your yearly Social Security benefits. This is also known as your "modified adjusted gross income" or "MAGI."



If you file your income taxes as "married - filing jointly," and your combined income for both you and your husband is more than \$32,000, then up to 50 percent of your Social Security benefits will become taxable income. If your MAGI is over \$44,000 then up to 85 percent of your Social Security benefits will become taxable. What that means in tax dollars depends upon your normal income tax rate as defined by the IRS. For information, the MAGI clip levels are lower when filing as an individual - if filing "single" MAGI over \$25,000 means that up to 50 percent of Social Security benefits are taxable and MAGI over \$34,000 means that up to 85 percent of Social Security benefits are taxable. But the advantages of filing jointly versus filing single usually more than offset the difference (though you may want to consult a tax advisor to confirm that).

As to your last question, an inheritance won't affect your monthly Social Security benefit (only your earnings from working will affect your Social Security benefit), but if that inheritance is taxable by the IRS, then the portion of your Social Security benefits which are taxable could be affected, as described above.



Multinational forces embarked as South America task force is underway

CAMP PENDLETON - Partners from four Central and South American nations embarked on USS *Wasp* (LHD 1) with U.S. Marines as part of Special Purpose Marine Air-Ground Task Force- WASP.

Marines and Sailors from Argentina, Brazil, Colombia, and El Salvador joined SPMAGTF-WASP to provide amphibious and cultural subject matter expertise to the task force's mission.

The newly formed Special Purpose Marine Air-Ground Task Force - WASP departed Naval Base San Diego on Sept. 25 for their month-long deployment to South America.

"Embarking on USS *Wasp* with our Central and South American partners is an incredible opportunity to work together, alongside our Navy brothers and sisters," said Sgt Maj. Stuart Glass, SPMAGTF-WASP sergeant major. "Having Marines more familiar with expeditionary operations afloat makes us effective as a unified Navy-Marine Corps when responding to crises world-wide."

While aboard, amphibious leaders from five nations rehearsed the rapid response planning process during various crisis response scenarios. The purpose of these mission rehearsals was to enhance naval integration and build mutual understanding of roles and responsibilities during humanitarian assistance and disaster response evolutions.

"The Navy-Marine Corps team is a vital part of our nation's crisis response force," said Col. Andrew Priddy, commanding officer of SPMAGTF-WASP. "What makes us the most effective and capable unit is not that we are a land force who can embark on ships but that we are part of a fleet Marine force that can go ashore."

Multinational planners from Central and South America aboard an amphibious ship with Marines is a rare and highly valuable opportunity for partner nations to train side-by-side in the U.S. Southern Command area of responsibility.

"Integration with our South American partners allows us to



exchange operational knowledge, forge enduring relationships, and increase our ability to respond to humanitarian disasters as a singular force," said Capt. Daniel Vacchio, SPMAGTF-WASP's lead planner.

Training opportunities such as SPMAGTF-WASP allows the U.S. Marine Corps to increase naval integration, interoperability and improve effectiveness as an expeditionary force. Additionally, working with partner nation militaries creates a unified effort to respond to contingencies such as humanitarian crises and natural disasters.

USS Dewey earns Spokane Trophy from Navy League

SAN DIEGO - The crew of guided-missile destroyer USS Dewey (DDG 105) received the 2018 Spokane Trophy during a ceremony aboard the ship, Sept. 26.

Ivan Urnovitz, president of the Spokane Navy League, spoke of his excitement to come from the Pacific Northwest to present the Spokane Award, which is presented annually to the U.S. Pacific Fleet surface combatant ship considered to be the most proficient in overall combat systems readiness and warfare operations. The award recognizes a ship's ability to conduct sustained simultaneous and coordinated Air Warfare (AW), Surface Warfare (SUW) and Undersea Warfare (USW) operations with all installed equipment.

The Spokane Trophy was established in 1908 by President Theodore Roosevelt to recognize naval warfighting proficiency. The trophy is kept on permanent display at the Naval Surface

Force, Pacific Fleet headquarters building in San Diego.

Dewey is a first-time winner of the honored Spokane Award sponsored by the Spokane, Washington Council of the Navy League of the United States.

Rear Adm. Fred I. Pyle, the commander of Carrier Strike Group Three, who traveled from Bremerton, Wash., to attend the ceremony, said the men and women of Dewey proved themselves worthy of receiving this award, citing their accomplishments during 2018, including Dewey's training for the US Navy fleet, and multi-national exercises to improve joint interoperability. Dewey partnered

with Japan and the Republic of Korea and won all seven of their Surface Action Group vs. Surface Action Group engagements, conducting more than 20 hours of active anti-submarine warfare tracking during the USS Carl Vinson strike group Sustainment Exercise.

As the Air and Missile Defense Commander for Expeditionary Strike Group 3, Dewey was part of the Joint Strike Fighter integration, assisting in developing techniques and procedures in support of future operations. Dewey was hand selected to test fire hyper velocity projectiles, Nulka decoys and Tomahawk Cruise Missiles.

Pyle concluded that "while systems we use are continuously modernized and become more complex, success in warfare will always be based on the Sailors to prepare, plan, operate, and maintain our ships and warfighting systems."

Dewey is attached to Carrier Strike Group 1 and is also a winner of the 2018 Battle Excellence Award. Commissioned in Seal Beach, Calif., in 2010, USS Dewey is the third ship named after Adm. George Dewey, who was regarded as the hero of the Battle of Manila Bay during the Spanish-American War.

Marine who drowned saving 2 children remembered as 'one of our best'

A Marine who drowned while saving two children in San Diego two weeks ago was a master sergeant who deployed to Iraq and Afghanistan while serving nearly two decades in uniform.

Master Sgt. Jeffrey Briar was a command and control systems chief with Tactical Training Exercise Control Group, based at Marine Corps Air Ground Combat Center Twentynine Palms. Briar died in an accidental drowning on Sept. 22, after saving two children, according to data from the Naval Safety Center, which tracks serious mishaps and accidents.

Col. Matthew Reid, the Tactical Training Exercise Control Group's director, told Military.com that Briar was "one of our best."

"We're all saddened by this tragic event, but proud of him and we will never forget him and his service," Reid said. "Our thoughts, prayers, and never-ending support go out to Master Sergeant Briar's family and friends during this difficult time and beyond."

Briar, who was from Oakland, Mich., joined the Marine Corps in May 2000, according to his career records. He served with the Camp Pendleton-based 3rd Battalion, 1st Marines and 1st Battalion, 11th Marines; and 8th Communication Battalion in North Carolina, among other units.

He deployed to Iraq in 2003 and 2007 and to Afghanistan in 2013. Last year, Briar also deployed with a Marine expeditionary unit.

The master sergeant's death remains under investigation. Members of the Briar's family could not immediately be reached for comment.

He's at least the second Marine to drown while off duty this year. In May, a lance corporal died while swimming after getting caught in a rip tide in Emerald Isle, N.C.

Briar's personal medals included the Combat Action Ribbon, the Navy and Marine Corps Commendation Medal, and the Navy and Marine Corps Achievement Medal.

A GoFundMe account set up to benefit Briar's family states that the master sergeant died on his wedding day, and that the children he saved were his step children. But Debbie Robinson, Briar's mother, disputes that account. She told Marine Corps Times, which reported Briar's death on Wednesday, that the Go Fund Me account is "false and fraudulent" and was being investigated. Her son wasn't married, she told the paper, and he didn't save his girlfriend's kids.

Military.com was not immediately able to confirm the details stated on the GoFundMe page, which has raised more than \$2,000. The person who organized the fundraising account didn't respond to a request for comment.

Navy sets up permanent Advancement-to-Position program for enlisted Sailors

MILLINGTON, Tenn. - Based on positive fleet feedback and the success of recent pilot programs, the Navy announced Oct. 7 that it has permanently established the Active Duty Enlisted Advancement-to-Position (A2P) program.

The A2P program offers active duty E-5s, or second-class petty officers, the opportunity to advance to E-6 (petty officer first class) by filling priority billets and successfully completing any required training or schools. The program is intended to improve Fleet readiness and manning through better distribution of our talent.

Sailors selected for A2P will receive permanent change of station orders as they would for a standard billet; however, applicants will only be considered for the specific A2P billets they've applied to.

Applicants must be active-duty E-5s who are in their detailing window for rotation and have taken the most recent E-6 Navy-wide advancement exam with published results. Sailors must be qualified to fill the billets for which they

apply and should contact their detailers if they have any questions about their ability to fill an A2P billet.

All eligible Sailors may apply to sea-duty billets, regardless of their sea/shore flow rotation. However, Sailors on shore duty who are due to rotate to sea duty will not be considered for shore-duty A2P billets.

A2P billets will be announced in Career Management System-Interactive Detailing under the "Advance to Position" category. Sailors should verify that the "Advance to Position" category is selected in the optional input portion of the CMS-ID job search page in order to see the available A2P billets. A limited number of billets will be announced each detailing cycle, and not all rates will have billets available each cycle. Applications for A2P billets work the same as standard cycle applications.







2020 Corvette Stingray Retractable hardtop - the LA Reveal

Just as they did when they announced the all-new, mid-engine 2020 C8 (eighth generation) Corvette in July, on both the West and the East Coasts of the U.S., once again Chevrolet held simultaneous reveals of the first-ever, hardtop Corvette convertible.

The East Coast reveal was in Florida, while the West Coast reveal was at The Motoring Club - a new social club for car enthusiasts, hidden away in a non-descript industrial building. Fittingly, The Motoring Club is a place where Los Angelenos store their high-performance cars for safekeeping, bringing them out to drive. We were told that Chevrolet was the first car manufacturer to be there.

When we arrived, the car was completely covered. A countdown clock projected the time remaining until the reveal, on a nearby screen. We milled about, snacking on drinks and hors d'oeuvres, as we wondered and speculated upon what Chevrolet had in store for us.

In the meantime, a beautiful, white, vintage Corvette convertible held our attention and served as the subject of many photographs.

Shortly before the reveal, we were introduced to two representatives of the Corvette's interior and exterior design teams. The excitement was palpable, as we all crowded in ever-closer to the hidden car, eager to take our first photographs of it.

Soon the countdown clock reached zero and the car cover was removed, revealing a beautiful orange Corvette Stingray.

After we finished taking our first round of frenzied photographs, eager to post them on social media before the 5 p.m. release of the full press materials to the public, the design team representatives walked around the car, giving us an insightful overview of its design features and answering our questions.

For the exterior, key Corvette features and the traditional Corvette athletic proportions were kept. It is quite different from the coupe in that when the top is down, nacelles visually bridge the interior and the exterior. That is integrated with a powerful-looking vent that extracts a lot of heat out of the engine. The nacelles keep air recirculation out of the interior when the top is down.


From the very beginning, a great deal of effort was put into making the car look just as spectacular when the top is down as when it is up.

One nice thing about putting the engine in the middle is that it brings the cowl so low that you see much of the interior from the outside. That is not something that you would necessarily think about, but when they were designing it they actually had to walk around, making sure that there was just as much excitement generated, making you want to get inside and see something exotic that you've never experienced before.

On the interior side, they were trying to keep the dash as low as possible. If the screen was in the center, your climate controls would go up, so they had to come up with a new engineering way to move those controls. What they came up with was very cool, very jet-inspired, to help keep the dashboard as low as possible.

Everything in the interior is real materials. They wanted to do away

with any of the plastics, so it's all real leather, real aluminum, real carbon fiber. Everything you touch has been thought about, to make sure it is a really rich and inviting experience. When you're coming

to the game with an exotic, hyper car, you have to really deliver on all those little experiences and make sure that you're going above and beyond what people are normally going to expect.

There is less than 80 pounds of difference to the coupe, so performance numbers will be very close. Furthermore, they did not lose any of the practicality and storage from the coupe to the convertible, even though the top folds down. That was a key design objective.

The two-piece top can be activated at speeds up to 30 mph. That may be the fastest speed of any manufacturer, for activating a retractable hardtop.

Incredibly, the convertible will be priced only \$7,500 more than the entry 1LT Stingray coupe.

I sat at the old stool and vanity that we had inherited from Francis' Italian grandmother. It still showed burn marks from her cigarettes. I wanted to channel her 1940s glamour, but my hair wasn't cooperating. Ever since we'd been stationed in Monterey, California, it frizzed every afternoon when the fog rolled in off the Pacific.

I was pleasantly surprised that my black velvet dress fit over my baby bump without too much strain at its rhinestone buttons, but my pregnancy "glow" looked more like my face, knees and feet had been inflated with a bicycle pump.

I anchored my hopeless bangs around the barrel of my hot curling iron, and smiled in the mirror. I was excited to experience my first Navy Ball, and wanted to look just right.

"Are you about done? We're going to be late," Francis said again, pacing behind the vanity in his dress blues.

"But the Ball isn't until six-thirty," I said, feeling his tension building behind me.

"Yes, but we committed to go to Dave's pre-party, and it starts in 45 minutes."

Bawling over the Navy Ball

Dave's house was only ten minutes away, but I knew that Francis had inherited his tendency to add unnecessary tension to life from the hot-headed men on his Italian side. "I've got at least 20 more minutes to get ready. Why are you stressing out?" I asked, clanking my curling iron onto the vanity in frustration.

Momentarily, Francis left me to my routine. Before applying make up, I decided to put on my control top pantyhose.

The precursor to Spanx, control top pantyhose were an essential part of 90s formalwear. They included a tight spandex girdle attached to sheer nylon hosiery, intended to slim unwanted girth. But wrestling a pair onto one's lower body was a daunting task for anyone, much less one who is pregnant.

I slid my thumbs into the right leg opening, bunching each side until I'd reached the reinforced toe. Balancing on the vanity stool with my right foot over my left knee, I compressed my swollen belly against my lap and held my breath. I inserted my foot into the hose, and gingerly pulled them to my knee. Releasing my right foot back to the floor, I took a few pants then held my breath again while I jerked my left foot up over my right knee, and repeated the process with the left leg of the pantyhose.

Then, I stood and began the

exhausting process of pulling the spandex girdle up over my thighs, hips and belly. I shimmied back and forth, huffed and puffed, and spastically marched in place to get the girdle up, but gave myself a wedgie in the process. After re-adjusting my underwear, I finally yanked the waistband over my belly and plopped back onto the stool, breathless and red faced.

"Honey, we have to go now. We're going to be late," Francis startled me in the bedroom doorway.

"Alright! To hell with it, let's go if you insist!" I blared, tears falling in a sudden hormonal burst. I yanked the curling iron plug from the wall, jammed my swollen feet into my heels, and stormed out to the car, crying all the way.

Of course, Dave was surprised to see us there so early, and his other guests didn't arrive for at least 15 minutes. Francis introduced me sheepishly, his pregnant wife with the puffy red eyes, frizzy hair, and no make up.

Over the next 24 years, Francis and I attended many Navy Balls, and each time, I did my hair and make up at that same old stool and vanity. Still do. But Francis never again pressured me to leave before I was ready. I like to think that his Italian grandmother's spirit taught him this lesson all those years ago: Before the ball, don't mess with your wife and her vanity.


